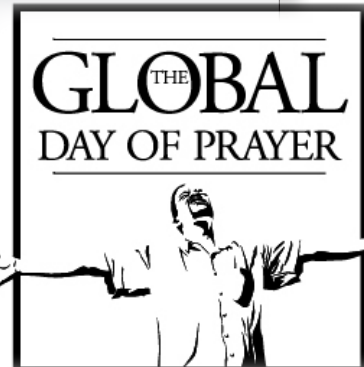

## from the pastor's heart

Every morning when you wake up, what is usually the first thought that hits your mind? Is it joy, faith, hope, thanksgiving or anxiety, worries, fear, hurt or even bitterness? Very often what we wake up with in the morning will hover over our mind for the rest of the day.

King David wrote Psalm 59 in response to a situation where he was threatened by a vicious, blood thirsty enemy every moment of the day. The first 15 verses speak of his desperate situation. Then he begins verse 15 with the word BUT:

“But I will sing of your strength, in the morning I will sing of Your love; for You are my fortress my refuge in times of trouble. O my Strength, I sing praise to You; You, O God, are my fortress, my loving God.” Psalm 59:16-17

I believe his setting God as His focus from dawn to dusk is the secret of his victory. His traumatic years running from enemies and soldiers of the insecure, jealous King Saul did not destroy him. Instead it made him the King after God's own heart. His rule over Israel brought about her most glorious days.

In this especially trying time, worries and fear are lurking to take captive of our mind. Let's be on our knees the first thing every morning. Let's dwell in His presence, and face up to every challenge that comes during the day, with God - our real Source of strength, help and wisdom.

“Let the morning bring me word of your unfailing love, for I have put my trust in you. Show me the way I should go, for to you I lift up my soul.” Psalm 143:8

Over 70 members from different congregations divided into 6 teams will be going to different parts of China for short term missions. All who are not going this time are asked to be involved by praying for them.
