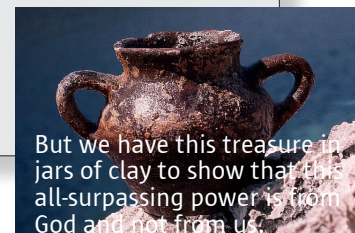

## from the pastor's heart

Sorrow is an inseparable part of life. If we choose to love it is inevitable that we have also chosen to sorrow. The deeper the love, the greater the sorrow. Last Sunday we received news of the demise of our LCEC member, sister Peggy Ng, who had gone to Zhongdian to visit her son after her mission trip in Kunming. On the evening of her arrival she lost consciousness while resting in her room and could not be revived at the hospital emergency room. When I heard this news I was greatly saddened and spent the night tossing and turning in bed. I recalled her partnership with the Cantonese Congregation MC and LCEC, sharing together the ups and downs of ministry, and the way she faced life's difficulties with good humour. It was still so fresh in my memory.

On Aug 16 I had sent her and the other team members off at the airport together with Ps Emily. We prayed together and I even had a photo taken with Peggy, her daughter and her mother-in-law. Little did I know that it would be my last with her. I could not escape the momentary despair brought on by denial and suppression until I sought the Lord. I lifted up to our gracious Lord my pain and also entrusted to him Peggy's family. As I quietly waited on God, the Holy Spirit comforted me and spoke to me. We all have a reason for passing away; and the Lord took sister Peggy away while she was resting, to peacefully see Him face to face. She has finished her earthly labour and mission and now she is with the Lord in heaven to enjoy the blessings he has prepared for her. Let us give thanks to God as we celebrate her life and ministry. Her leaving is our loss but her life's journey has been affirmed and received by our Lord Jesus Christ.

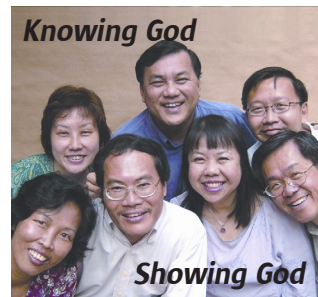
Through this incident God has reminded each of us that on our journey to heaven, we not only love our nearest and dearest but that

## church prayer agenda

Every member of the teams who went for Missions between July & August returned with encouraging reports about encountering the awesome God in different ways. The people whom they ministered to in the field were blessed by the presence of our people – but our people felt they were blessed even more by their obedience in going. May all KY people flow along in full participation as God leads KY to extend the 'Tent' for Missions in the year to come.

1) Ask God to call out from KY this generation of worshippers who will consciously hear and obey the Word of the Lord as did the early disciples in the Upper Room, and in the Antioch Church. Let us allow ourselves to be mobilized to get involved in Overseas Missions; and Missions at the Doorstep that will cause "every knee to bow in heaven and on earth, and every tongue to confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father" (Phil 2:10-11)

2) Pray for our missionaries by name, those who have stepped out in faith to serve God in the mission field. They have given up their rights, comfort and convenience, and exposing their young children to lower quality medical care, so that unreached people may have the opportunity to hear the Good News, and receive Jesus. Remember them daily on matters which God brings to our mind.

3) Acknowledge to God that there is no power like that of prevailing prayer:

- Moses standing in prayer between the Red Sea and the pursuing Egyptian army

- Elijah standing at Mt Carmel in prayer against the 450 prophets of Baal

Prevailing prayers that turn ordinary mortals into people of power; and resulting in God's intervention into our situations.

Stir the hearts of people to be motivated to pray, till KY purposefully functions as a House of Prayer for powerful missions to all peoples.
