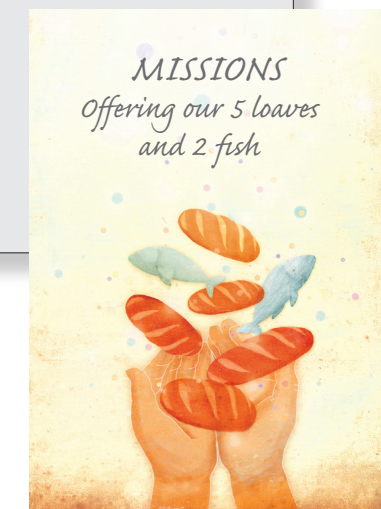

## from the pastor's heart

According to a report in an English magazine on World Missions, almost 100 million Christians were martyred in the 100 years of the 20th century. Most of these Christian martyrs were from Islamic nations or communist nations. Even in democratic countries many Christians face opposition to their faith from family and traditions. An article in a 1997 copy of Reader's Digest estimated that all over the world about 200-250 million Christians will likely face the danger of persecution anytime. We are very blessed and privileged to believe in Jesus without fear for our lives but this does not mean that we do not need the antibodies of faith to help us fight against other forms of attack.

Christians have antibodies toward the sins of the world, the most important of which is "allowing the Word of God to do its work in our hearts". Apostle Paul said: "And we also thank God continually because, when you received the word of God, which you heard from us, you accepted it not as the word of men, but as it actually is, the word of God, which is at work in you who believe." (1 Thessalonians 2:13) Paul rejoiced over the Thessalonian believers because they not only received the word of God but more significantly they allow the word of God to work in them. In the original language of the Bible, "at work" means "to have effect". When the word of God is active in our hearts then we will have resistance towards the sins and challenges of the world. In addition to this, our resistance level is also increased when we go on short term mission trips.

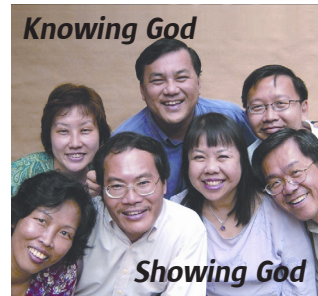

## church prayer agenda

"Enlarge the space of your tent. Stretch your tent curtain wide. Do not hold back. Lengthen your cords, strengthen your stakes" (Is 54:2)

God led KY in enlarging her tent in overseas and local missions. Not only in missions, but also in raising up more lay-workers and in deepening KY people's commitment in the Lord Jesus. That's not all - God expects more from KY in the New Year - to enlarge our 'tent' in every KY ministry in every congregation.

1. Our enlarged 'tent' only stands as strong as the individual 'stakes' (tent pegs) which hold the tent cords are strong. Ask God to strengthen our 'stakes' - particularly in:

- The harmony and unity within the pastoral and lay leadership; and between members of the different congregations.
- Our personal walk with God
- Our discipline in prayer and His Word
- Our love and trust for each other

2. Ask God for the spirit of Joshua - that we will be more impressed by the greatness of our GOD than by the size of the task; or the obstacles and problems before us. Help us to trust GOD who is faithful and who is able to do great, mighty and impossible things through us according to the power of the Holy Spirit who lives within us.

3. As overseas and local missions mobilization continue to enlarge in KY, ask God to raise up, and empower KY elders who will intentionally devote themselves to encourage, affirm and disciple emerging workers and leaders, and help them to discover their unique gifting and place in God's plan.
